SPRING CLEAN-UP

Public Works Staff will be picking up organic material starting **May 6th**.

Please refer to the schedule below for your area and dates:

Redstone	May 6-10
South of Columbia	May 6-10
Pinewood	May 13-17
North of Columbia	May 13-17
Blackbear Area	May 13-17

The City will be driving by each residence **once**- please ensure all items are on the boulevard by **7:00 am starting the week of your pick up**.

Any items placed on boulevard after City crews have passed by their residence will **not** be picked up.

Tree Trimmings MUST be under 10 cm in diameter and 3 m length. **Piles** can be no larger than **1.2 meters in diameter** and limit to a **maximum of 3 piles** per home. Please bundle using rope that is **strong enough** to lift branches and place on an unmaintained boulevard so our loader will be able to easily access your pile.

Yard Waste **ONLY** leaves and grass clippings can be **placed in a pile on your unmaintained boulevard** **OR** be placed in **clear** plastic bags not weighing more than 20 lbs / 9 kg.
(Absolutely NO tree trimmings, dirt, sod, rocks, etc. in bags)
Any overweight bags will be left on the boulevard.

Gravel & Sand Please rake gravel and sand onto asphalt surface (**do not make piles**)

The City of Rossland will pick up only the items listed. It will be the owner's responsibility to take all other refuse to the appropriate recycling facilities or the landfill site.

Once pick-up in your area is completed, the City will send the sweeper around to clean your street in the weeks following.

NEW DOG BYLAW



Council has adopted the new Animal Control Bylaw No. 2548 in response to the City questionnaire sent out late in 2012.

The following are the significant changes to that Bylaw:

- Leashed dogs are now permitted in the downtown core.
- Dogs must not be left unattended (tied up) in the downtown core.
- Fine structure is now cumulative over the lifetime of a dog.

Council has directed staff to increase Bylaw enforcement and a \$50.fine will be levied for leaving a dog tied up in the downtown core.

BURNING BYLAW

Under Bylaw No. 2383 yard waste burning is prohibited at all times. Any fire reported will be extinguished by the City or the Fire Department. Yard waste is accepted at the McKelvey Creek Landfill, Trail, B.C.

DOWNTOWN PARKING

Please remember that there is a 2 hour parking limit in the downtown core. If you need to park for a longer period of time please use the parking lots located at:

- Queen Street – behind the Nelson and District Credit Union
- Washington Street – behind Pro Hardware and beside the Thrift Store
- Columbia Avenue – behind the Post Office (entry from Washington and 1st.)

Please respect handicap parking spots and refrain from parking in non-designated parking spots (in, on or around the sidewalk bump outs). Parking tickets will be issued for these offences
